GENERAL CONTEXT

The health system in Côte d'Ivoire is made up of the public sector, the private sector, and traditional medicine. It is under the responsibility of the Ministry of Health, Public Hygiene and Universal Health Coverage (MSHPCMU). "Côte d'Ivoire continues its march towards development. In the health sector, the vast hospital program which was launched in 2018 has accelerated in recent months, with a view to offering quality care to populations throughout the national territory and consolidating the implementation of Universal Health Coverage (CMU)".

Ivory Coast has launched the "Abidjan Medical City" project since 2019. Good health is the basis of good productivity and good socio-economic health. The public health sector remains the main actor in the Ivorian health system. It is divided into three levels: primary, secondary and tertiary, and produces 60% of the healthcare provision. To provide the country with a network of quality health infrastructure, accessible to all, the Ivorian government has undertaken the construction, rehabilitation and equipment of University Hospital Centers (CHU), Regional Hospital Centers (CHR) and of General Hospitals (HG) throughout the national territory. These Hospital Centers are equipped with the latest generation equipment.

The private health sector is essentially made up of for-profit health establishments. it represents on average 40% of the healthcare offering in Ivory Coast and 90% of the national health insurance offering. More than 80% of health establishments are located in Abidjan in the economic capital. There are approximately 1,200 private health establishments (polyclinics, clinics, medical centers and medical practices) across the country.

Geographic location

Ivory Coast is a West African country, member of the African Union. With an area of 322 462 km², it is limited to the north by Mali and Burkina Faso, to the west by Liberia and Guinea, to the east by Ghana and to the south by the Atlantic Ocean.

Economic situation

The world's leading producer of cocoa and cashew nuts, Ivory Coast has recorded one of the fastest and sustained rates of economic growth in sub-Saharan Africa for more than ten years. With real GDP growth of 8.2% on average over the period 2012-2019, Côte d'Ivoire managed to contain the COVID-19 pandemic to keep the pace of positive growth in 2020 at 2%.

In 2021, the country returned to its strong growth trajectory and continues to play a central role as a regional economic hub and host land for many nationals of the Economic Community of West African States countries. (ECOWAS) and elsewhere.

In 2022, Ivorian economic activity remained robust, although it faced challenges arising from Russia's invasion of Ukraine, global monetary tightening, and increasing political instability in the country. West African Economic and Monetary Union (**UEMOA**). Despite rising import prices, rising global and domestic interest rates, as well as falling external demand, economic growth fell from 7% in 2021 to 6.7% in 2022.

Growth was largely driven by sustained public investment and strong domestic consumption. The industrial and service sectors as well as the government's fiscal measures aimed at controlling price increases also contributed to this economic performance during the first half of the year.

Inflation averaged 5.2% in 2022, marking its highest level in a decade, driven by rising food, transport and energy prices. Nevertheless, the short- and medium-term economic outlook remains positive, although slightly below pre-COVID-19 levels. This optimism is based on a strong commitment to macroeconomic stability and ongoing structural reforms in accordance with the National Development Plan (PND 2021-2025).

Looking ahead, real GDP growth is expected to average 6.5% in 2024-25. Continued investment in network infrastructure, particularly in the digital and transportation sectors, as well as the exploitation of recent oil discoveries, combined with prudent macroeconomic policies, are expected to strengthen business confidence and increase productivity. Projects aimed at developing value chains have the potential to improve agricultural productivity and boost manufacturing, which will support long-term growth prospects.

Political situation

Ivory Coast organized municipal and regional elections in September 2023, largely won by the RHDP [Rally of Houphouetists for Democracy and Peace], the party in power since 2011. This double election serves as a test for the main political parties, of the country in view of the 2025 presidential election, was unanimously hailed as inclusive, open and peaceful by all national and international observers. Since the resolution of tensions linked to the 2020 presidential election, after which President Ouattara was re-elected for a third consecutive term, Ivory Coast has experienced notable political and social stability.

FOASPS /WAPHF is a non-profit regional umbrella association of national federations headquartered in Dakar, Senegal. There are currently ten (10) national federations (Benin, Burkina Faso, Ivory Coast, Ghana, Liberia, Mali, Niger, Nigeria, Senegal, Togo) as full members with five (5) additional countries (Cape Verde, Gambia, Guinea, Guinea Bissau and Sierra Leone) on the path to


